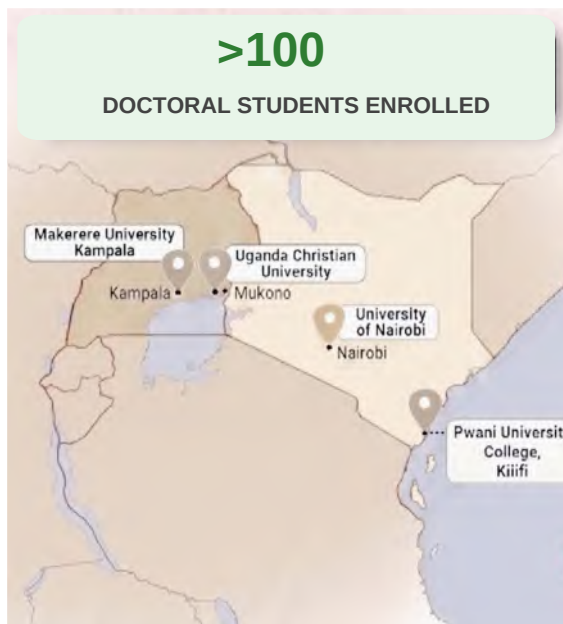

4. Stakeholder Involvement

Bridging Academia, Agricultural Market and Research Gaps

Partner universities leverage External Advisory Boards (EABs) and alumni networks to institutionalize dialogue with key employers across Uganda and Kenya, including ministries, NGOs, and UN agencies. Co-aligning doctoral training with labor market needs ensures long-term curriculum relevance and enhances PhD employability.

Key Challenge	ADVALUE Solution
Communication & Skills Gap PhDs offer strong theoretical specialization, but lack entrepreneurial skills and public communication.	Problem-Solving Focus Shift PhD training toward applied, entrepreneurial skills and societal relevance.
Academic-Industry Disconnect Outdated university structures prioritize academic metrics over real-world agricultural innovation.	Flexible Topics & Agility Allow industry-driven, flexible PhD topics grounded in socio-economic realities.
Conflicting Supervision Students get caught between theoretical university expectations and practical enterprise needs.	Joint Supervision Institutionalize joint academic-enterprise supervision to align expectations and mentor support.
Financial & Timeline Strains Limited funding forces students to pause studies for work, prolonging degree completion.	Funded Placements Provide paid enterprise internships and affiliations so students sustain momentum without financial breaks.
Lack of Practical Exposure Minimal field experience, limited access to resources, and limited stakeholder engagement.	Institutionalized MoUs Formalize long-term MoUs and simple agreements with External Advisory Boards for sustained collaboration.

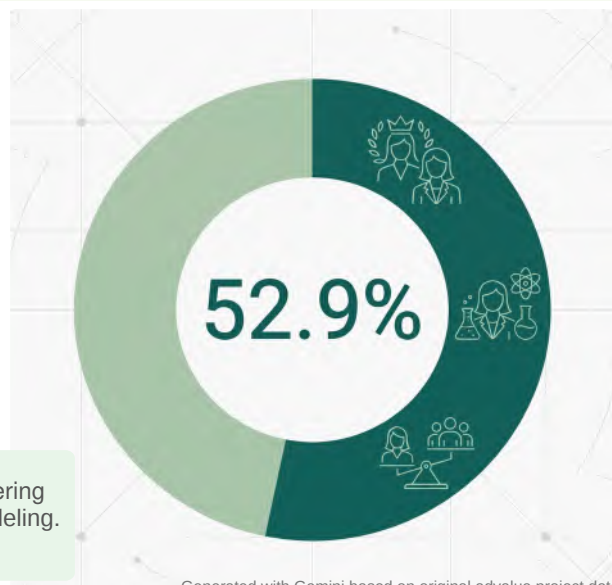

7. Gender and Inclusion (GEID)

ADVALUE is committed to embedding Gender Equity, Inclusion, and Diversity (GEID) into every stage of its project cycle management, research design, and doctoral teaching. Recognizing that agricultural value-chain transformation requires diverse perspectives, the project actively addresses structural inequalities, gender biases, and inclusion barriers within higher education across Kenya and Uganda.

Institutional Capacity Building

Guided by an appointed Gender Officer and a cross-institutional Gender Working Group (GWG), ADVALUE provides targeted webinars and on-site training to strengthen faculty capacity in gender-responsive research and teaching methods.

Gender-Responsive PhD Curriculum

The four advanced PhD modules integrate intersectional perspectives and gender-sensitive methodologies. This prepares doctoral candidates to address the distinct needs of both women and men across agricultural value chains.

Global & Regional Alignment

The GEID framework strictly aligns with the Global Policy Framework (UN SDG 5 on Gender Equality, CEDAW), European Union principles of equity and non-discrimination, and national gender policy frameworks in Uganda and Kenya.

8. Raising Standards: Quality Framework

Evidence-Based Quality Framework for Transdisciplinary Doctoral Education

Doctoral education in East African agricultural and agro-environmental sciences faces systemic bottlenecks: low on-time completion rates (ranging from 4% to 25%), overburdened supervisors, and a heavy focus on primary production over broader value-chain dynamics.

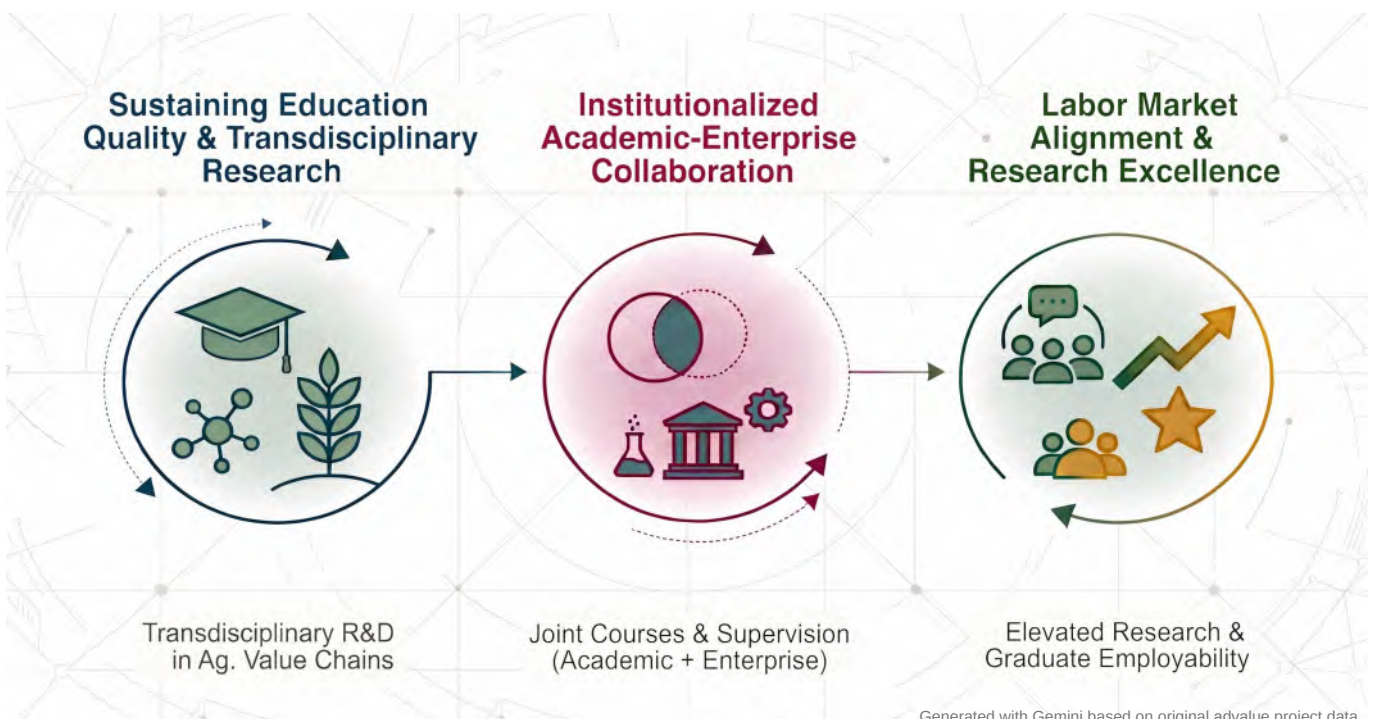
To address these challenges, the ADVALUE project established a unified quality framework built on a comprehensive needs analysis across partner universities in Kenya and Uganda. By synthesizing insights from academic staff, PhD candidates, and external stakeholders, the project ensures that module content directly targets existing pedagogical, structural, and market gaps.



Regulatory Accreditation Compliance

Modules adhere strictly to regulatory standards set by National Council for Higher Education (NCHE) in Uganda and Commission for University Education (CUE) in Kenya:

- **Workload & Credit Structure:** Benchmarked at 60 contact hours (4 Credit Units), blending lectures, practical work, and field exposure.
- **Core Competencies:** Designed around measurable outcomes in transdisciplinary research, scientific communication, and value-chain management.
- **Stakeholder Co-Creation:** Driven by continuous feedback from External Advisory Boards and industry leaders.

ADVALUE is transforming East African doctoral education by bridging the gap between academic research and agricultural market needs across Kenya and Uganda.

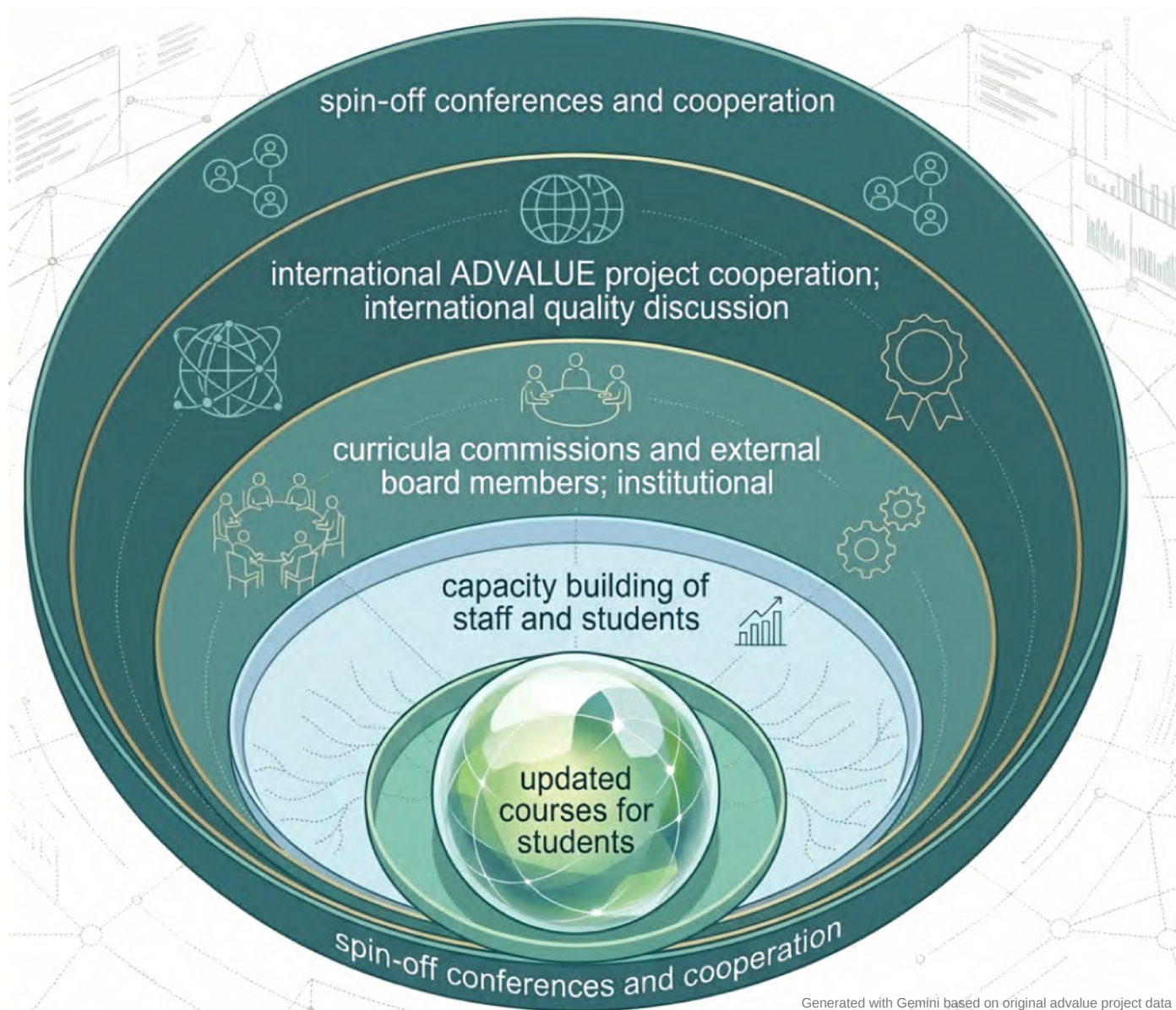

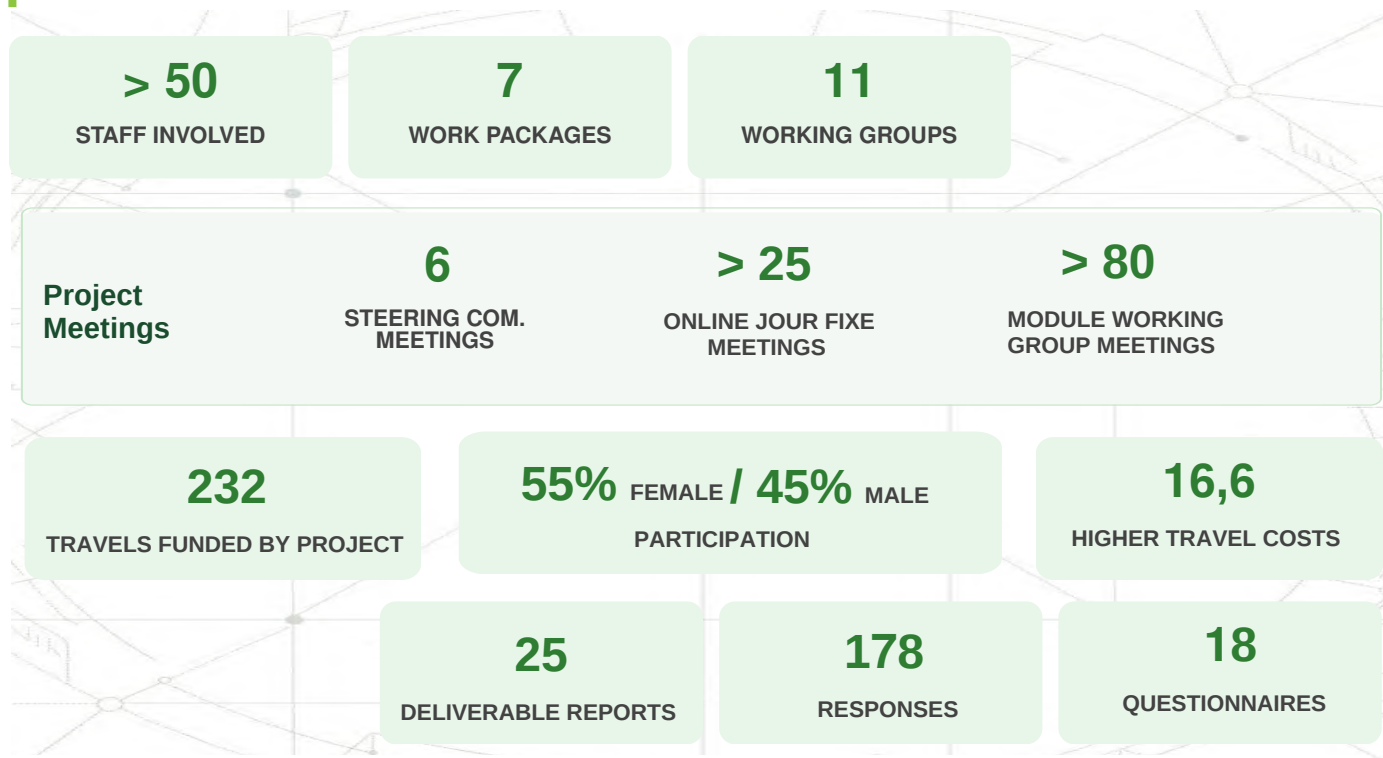
